



## APPENDIX I – PROJECT SPECIFICATION

#### Brief Description:

The Employability Wellbeing Service (A) “EWS-A” is a £1.67m project to be delivered across the Hull and East Riding of Yorkshire (HEY) geography, enhancing access to employment for individuals living and working in HEY, providing support to individuals with mental health issues to facilitate their engagement or re-engagement with the labour market.

The project responds to the European Social Fund (ESF) call Humber Mental Health Support (OC18S20P1779) and will tackle holistic mental health issues faced by individuals and their impact on labour market participation.

EWS-A has three primary objectives;

- To address mental health and other barriers preventing participation or causing disadvantage within the labour market, offering support tailored to individual need.
- To improve the employability and skills provision of long-term unemployed and inactive people, so that they can participate and compete effectively in the labour market.
- To facilitate employer engagement opportunities, cultivating entry points for participation including work placements, training opportunities and apprenticeships.

## **Total Project Outputs (*all partners contribute towards achieving*)**

The Project will deliver the following contracted outputs under IPI.1:

- **Outputs:**
  - 576 participants, of which
    - 288 male
    - 288 female
  - 353 participants unemployed, including long-term unemployed
  - 223 participants inactive
  - 108 participants over 50 years of age
  - 47 participants from ethnic minorities
  - 201 participants with disabilities
  - 102 participants without basic skills
  - 79 participants who live in a single adult household with dependent children
  
- **Results:**
  - 16% of unemployed participants will be in employment (including self-employment) on leaving.
  - 39% of inactive participants will be in employment or job search on leaving.
  - 18% of participants will gain basic skills.
  - 25% of participants will be in employment, including self-employment, six months after leaving.

The Project will deliver the following contracted outputs under IPI.2:

- **Outputs:**
  - 384 participants, of which
    - 192 male
    - 192 female
  - 225 participants unemployed, including long-term unemployed
  - 159 participants inactive
  - 32 participants from ethnic minorities
  - 115 participants with disabilities
  - 68 participants without basic skills
  - 45 participants who live in a single adult household with dependent children
  
- **Results:**
  - 18% of participants will gain basic skills.
  - 31% of participants (below 25 years of age) in employment, including self-employment, or education/ training upon leaving.
  - 34% of participants will be in employment, including self-employment, six months after leaving.
