

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# Introduction To Primary Stars



The Tigers Trust is supporting pupils across Hull and the East Riding to achieve Physical, Social and Emotional wellbeing goals. We are achieving this through a variety of programmes within our school's partnership model across curriculum and extra-curricular delivery.

These Programmes include:

- **Teacher CPD** - The Tigers Trust's qualified staff support teachers to increase their skill, confidence and knowledge in teaching PE. We do this through the Premier League Primary Stars Programme using tailored support which is designed to meet the needs of individual schools and their staff.

Targeted Interventions - Support for pupils who need it most, the Tigers Trust have programmes in:

- **Social Skills**
  - **Football Focused Behaviour Interventions**
  - **Resilience**
  - **Healthy Lifestyles**
  - **Mental Health**
  - **Inclusion**
  - **Reading**
  - **Young Leaders**
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- **Social Action** - Pupils are given the opportunity to tackle issues which are important to them, some successful stories of this include Mount Pleasant Juniors working on their project to protect the planet and Molescroft Primary School embedding Play/Sports Leaders into their extra-curricular activities.
  - **Assemblies** - Covering sporting values, key campaigns in the year such as Safer Internet Day, and current affairs as they happen.
  - **Events and Activation Days** - Focused visits to the MKM Stadium, World Book Day, Black History Month are all examples of how we use football to broaden pupil's horizons.
  - **Competitions** - Inter school events held throughout the year at regional and central locations, school sports days and in house small competitions. Events are delivered in a variety of formats to give pupils the best experience, whether that's competing for a medal or just being given the chance to represent their school.
  - **PPA Cover (PE)** - Following your schools curriculum to help pupils achieve their minimum of 2 hours PE a week.

# Case Study - Emily

At the Tigers Trust, we partner with Riverside Community School to deliver PE provision for the children throughout the academic year. While most of our sessions involve working with various classes, we have seen a remarkable student, Emily Atkin, excel in our sessions.

When we first started working with Emily in September 2023, she was enthusiastic about sport, especially football. However, Emily was diagnosed with Batten's Disease in January 2022, and she was struggling physically. Batten Disease is a rare neurodegenerative disorder that causes blindness, epilepsy, difficulties sleeping, decline of speech, language and swallowing, and deterioration of fine and gross motor skills. Since September, she has struggled with movement, as well as going from partially sighted to blind, and her speech deteriorating.

To support Emily, we worked closely with her, introducing sound-based equipment like a football with bells to improve her skills. Using this ball during lunchtime matches increased her confidence and engagement. She earned multiple 'Star of the Week' awards, embodying the Premier League Primary Stars values. Emily expressed her gratitude, saying, "Thank you for everything the Tigers Trust has done for me."

As Emily's condition deteriorated, we adjusted sessions to ensure Emily had similar challenges as the other children, with support from her teaching assistant. Despite her challenges, Emily always approached the sessions with a smile and gave her best effort, demonstrating incredible passion for sport.

Emily's teacher, Mrs. France, shared her pride in Emily's progress: "Emily has really enjoyed participating in Tigers Trust sessions. The steady pace has helped her develop ball skills, and her self-esteem has grown through her success at the weekly football club."

Marc Daddy, Premier League Primary Stars PE Officer, also praised Emily: "Emily is highly engaged with the programme, showing a strong passion for sport. Her core skills, including body coordination and football skills, have developed significantly."

On 27th April 2024, Emily had the incredible opportunity to be a mascot for Hull City vs Ipswich Town. After a mini tour of the MKM Stadium, she met the players and previous Head Coach Liam Rosenior. She also got to play on the pitch before proudly walking out with Hull City Defender Jacob Greaves, who wore ear defenders to support Emily. This was a special moment, embodying the inclusion at the heart of the Tigers Trust!

Olivia has also been excelling in Girls' Football, both within school and beyond, constantly eager to refine her skills whenever the opportunity arises.

As a special surprise, we arranged for Hull City midfielder Xavier Simons to visit Olivia. During this memorable moment, she was presented with an incredible opportunity to serve as one of the mascots for Hull City's Yorkshire derby against Leeds United—an experience that brought her immense joy and excitement.

When matchday arrived on Saturday, January 4th, Olivia had the chance to go behind the scenes at the MKM Stadium. She met the players before the game for autographs, participated in a skills session on the pitch, and enjoyed several other exciting experiences.

The highlight of the day came when Olivia led the Tigers out onto the pitch alongside captain Lewie Coyle, in front of a full MKM Stadium.


